Has Levels of Fluoride Above the Secondary Drinking Water Standards

Our water system recently violated a secondary drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we did and are doing to correct this situation.

The results of the analyses of fluoride from water samples collected on October 5^{th} at SS29 indicate that fluoride was at or above the Secondary Maximum Contaminant Level (SMCL) of 2.0 mg/l. The detected concentration at SS29 was 3.1 mg/l

What should I do?

You do not need to us an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply. Fluoride is an aesthetic concern. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor and dentist.

What does this mean?

At the levels shown above, fluoride in the water is not a public health concern. But it may cause brown stains and pitting in the teeth of children

What is being done?

Samples at the sample station and of our source water locations will be taken and monitored more frequently for any changes in the level of fluoride in the water.
